Fifth Grade Summer Reading

Hello St. Francis Borgia 5th Graders!!

The goal of summer reading is to grow a love of reading and maintain and improve reading level. This summer I'd like for you to read the book *The Lion, The Witch, and The Wardrobe* by *C.S. Lewis*. Students in 5th grade are encouraged to read 15 to 20 minutes a day. So if you read for 10 minutes, on weekdays only, you will have exceeded 400 minutes by the time school resumes. Read the sports section, read movie reviews, read the fashion magazines, read history books, read biographies, read fiction, read non-fiction, read mysteries, JUST READ!!

When we return to school in August we will discuss the book *The Lion, The Witch, and the Wardrobe* and you will have an assignment on the book. The assignment will include class discussion, and possibly written questions, quiz, or essay. I encourage you to take notes as you read in a reading journal or use sticky notes to mark important pages and events that stand out to you as you read the story. Pay attention to the characters and what happens as the story progresses. Bring your notes with you when you return to school in August.

This assignment could be in-class writing, a book talk, or a special project.
